But the case for restoring federal tax fairness is clear.

Despite racking up record profits, **corporations are supplying the smallest share of federal revenue in 60 years**. Some pundits claim that corporate tax rates are too high, but many of our most profitable corporations **are paying just one-third the official corporate tax rate**.
